Explanation of Changes

Occupancy increased for Office, Central Tokyo, and the total portfolio due to new tenants at the MIF Building and Ichigo Tameike Building despite the departure of a tenant at the Ichigo Shibuya East Building.

Value-Add Actions

As part of its ongoing efforts to increase tenant satisfaction via value-add capex, Ichigo Office renovated the common areas at the Ichigo Uchi Honmachi Building acquired last September, which has a vacant office section (104 m²).

The Ichigo Uchi Honmachi Building is conveniently located in Osaka's Tanimachi Yonchome, an area with a major road that has a cluster of government buildings including the Osaka Prefectural Government Office on the east side of the road and an office area used by small- and medium-sized companies, law offices, and tax accounting offices on the west side.

Ichigo Office will continue to carry out value-add capex tailored to tenant needs to increase tenant satisfaction and drive higher earnings for shareholders.
